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<sup>1</sup>Knots were placed at 0.3, 0.5, 0.7, 1, 1.5, 3, and 4 years. Ordinary least squares was used to fit this cumulative hazard function. Simulations that follow are based on this fitted survival curve, by drawing random standard exponentially-distributed random variables and solving for time  $t$  so that the fitted spline function equals the exponential random variable.
